The program provides students with advisement, writing support, portfolio creation, career services, and classroom observation in pursuit of the Child Development Associate Credential. Credits earned through the successful completion of these CDA courses may also be applied to degree programs, thus establishing the foundation for career advancement.

Benefits of the Credit Bearing CDA Program at CUNY SPS:

Graduates will earn 12 Early Childhood Education transferable credits.

Ability to take the national credentialing exam with the National Council of Professional Recognition.

Choice of one of four CDA Designations. Options include: Infant/Toddler, Preschool, Family Day Care and Home Visitor. Options include adding the Bilingual specialization.

The CDA Credential is transferable to all 50 states, and several countries.

Graduates of a Credit Bearing CDA will earn a Level 4 of 10 status on the NYS Works for Children Career Ladder.

Course content includes but not limited to health and safety in classrooms and playgrounds, lesson and activity planning, behavior management, basic child development, supporting children's social and emotional development, building relationships with families and colleagues, and understanding regulations and learning how to become a professional.
