ASQ-3 & ASQ:SE Administration Recommendations:

- Complete the ASQ:SE questionnaire at 6, 12, 18, 24, 30, 36, 48, and 60 month age intervals.
- Screen children with ASQ-3 at 2 and 4 months, then at 4 month intervals up to 24 months old, and at 6 month intervals until the child reaches 5 years old.
- Share questionnaires with parents or guardians 1-2 weeks prior to the child reaching the indicated age interval.
- For infants 3 or more weeks premature, use an adjusted age used up to 24 months for ASQ-3 (subtract # of weeks premature).

ASQ:SE & ASQ-3 Results & Next Steps:

Screening and referral process should be done in partnership with the family, & be based on individual child's needs. If family has concerns, please refer to appropriate services, regardless of screening test result.
